### The Sporting News

In February, Ray Shaw, CEO of American City Business Journals (ACBJ), parent company of the Sporting News, announced that ACBJ would be closing TSN's St. Louis, Missouri, office in July and moving its print editorial staff to Charlotte, North Carolina, its corporate headquarters. ACBJ had purchased TSN in October, 2006, from Paul G. Allen's Vulcan Sports Media.

Part of the decision to shutter the St. Louis office involved closing the Sporting News Research Center and eliminating the position held by Steve Gietschier, who had directed the Research Center since its creation in 1986. With the future of the Research Center's holdings in doubt, Gietschier proposed that ACBJ donate the TSN archives in their entirety to a local university. Three institutions stepped forward to embrace this plan enthusiastically, but in the end Shaw decided not to part with these materials. They were moved to Charlotte where their future is somewhat unclear.

## The Olympedia is Now Available on SPORTS Reference

This section on SPORTS Reference website is the work of many members of the International Society of Olympic Historians. Each of the original eight founders had been working on a results-based Olympic database for many years. They call themselves the OlyMADMen. In 1998 they started to work together on this database. The *About this Site* page describes the history of the development of the database. It also explains the problems with name and spelling verification, who the founders consider to be Olympians and the countries they represent.

There are results by each Olympic Game, by sports, by countries, a list of IOC members and sessions. For many Olympians a short biography is also available. The results by sports also give times or results for quarter and semi finals, when known, along with the final results. As of August 19, 2008, there are currently 110,017 known Olympians in this database. This source is a marvelous addition to the history of the Olympic Games and a desperately needed, comprehensive results database. A Glossary has been added to explain the many abbreviations, e.g. RNK - result not known; DNF - did not finish...

"America's National Game:" The Albert G. Spalding Collection of Early Baseball Photographs

Over 500 photographs, prints, drawings, caricatures, and printed illustrations from the personal collection of materials related to baseball and other sports gathered by the early baseball player and sporting-goods tycoon A. G. Spalding. This collection includes 19th-century studio portraits of players and teams of the day, rare images, photographs, and original drawings.

The personal collection of materials related to baseball and other sports gathered by the early baseball player and sporting-goods tycoon A.G. Spalding came to the Library in 1921 as a gift from his widow. During his lifetime, Spalding acquired the libraries of early Cincinnati Red Stockings center fielder Harry Wright and the early baseball journalist and inventor of the box score Henry Chadwick, two other notable figures in the history of baseball, and incorporated their materials with his own. The entire collection consists of more than 3,000 books and pamphlets; over 100 periodicals; numerous scrapbooks, scorebooks, and diaries; and other manuscript items that document the development of the sport from the mid-19th century to about 1914.

## CIC and Google Digitization Project

Mary Beth Allen, Applied Health Sciences Librarian, University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign sent a message a few months ago concerning the collaboration between the CIC libraries (Committee On Institutional Cooperation, <http://www.cic.uiuc.edu/>) and Google for digitizing approximately 1.2 million volumes in 20 subject areas. This project is called Collections of Distinction.

Two of the chosen subject areas are **outdoor recreation** and **sports & physical education**. Called the Big Ten Sports & Recreation, it is estimated that this collection has approximately 76,500 volumes. Discussions between CIC and

Google about this proposal are still ongoing, but it is expected that work on this part of the project to begin in the next year at some of the libraries. CIC member libraries at the Universities of Illinois, Minnesota, Ohio State and Penn State hold the main collections in this subject area.

A further transformation resulted in an online only collection of sport sciences theses called the *OregonPDF in Health & Performance*. As of August 2008 all subscribing libraries have online access to the 240 theses and dissertations that are added each year along with access to the earlier years. This change to an online only database has also resulted in a lowering of yearly subscription costs (now \$1500/yr instead of \$1848).

The ISBS is part of the Public Knowledge Project (PKP), <http://pkp.sfu.ca/> where open source software can be used on an organization/institution's website to support fulltext conference papers, proceedings, journals and books that are freely available. The PKP is sponsored by Stanford University, Simon Fraser University, Arizona State University and the Canadian Centre for Studies in Publishing. Two other sport science journals were also found: International Review of Sport Pedagogy and the Journal of Exercise and Sport Sciences.
