1.0 News from Sports Organizations

1.1 NASLIN

Notes from the ISHA/NASLIN Conference, Memphis, Tennessee, Nov. 1-3, 2006

The joint conference of the International Sports Heritage Association and the North American Sport Library Network was hosted by The National Pastime: Museum of Minor League Baseball in Memphis. This museum is located in the downtown Autozone Park that accommodates the Memphis Redbirds baseball playing field, management office space and media facilities. Conference sessions, the banquet and other social functions were held in these facilities.

Conference participants (and baseball fans) were entertained by the two featured speakers; John Zajc, Executive Director of the Society for American Baseball Research and Branch Rickey, Jr., grandson of the Wesley Branch Rickey (1881-1965), who developed the baseball farm system, was manager of the Dodgers, Cardinals and Pittsburgh Pirates and introduced Jackie Robinson to major league baseball.

Two NASLIN sessions were devoted to the topic of digital content preservation and distribution technologies. The sessions were presented by Michael Kennedy, Imaging Technology Consultant, and Michael Holobek, President, of Annapolis Technologies, LLC, Baltimore, Maryland (<http://www.annapolistech.com/>). Using the example of the digitizing work they are doing for AAF on the *Sporting Life* periodical, the two Michaels showed what a TIFF version would look like, a JPEG 2000 combined with a layered PDF. This latter two-part bitonal version produced the best results for this rather poorly printed, very brittle periodical. JPEG 2000 displays much faster than TIFF and can be viewed well with Adobe Acrobat Reader 7.0+. In addition with this software the ability to insert watermarks to identify rights ownership and other secure procedures could be added.

The *Sporting Life* backrun (1883-1917; 1922-1924) has approximately 50,000 pages to be digitized. Very few copies exist of this fragile, newsprint periodical. The National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum has agreed that their copy should be used for the project. Bindings of the bound backruns were cut so that each page can be gently slid onto a flatbed scanner for processing. The goal of the project is to produce the best-enhanced copy possible that has good optical character recognition. The major challenges include the fact that newsprint discoloration affects legibility and a small font size means a high-resolution capture must be used, thus creating a large file size. The goal is to have each page no bigger than one MB. The sample pages demonstrated were very readable and legible. It is evident that the time taken and the advanced technical expertise and software will produce a very good product that will benefit sport history researchers.

AAFLA Digital Conversion Project

Wayne Wilson, from the Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles presented a summary of the AAF digitization project from 1997 to 2006. The digitization project promotes the goals of the AAF; to support youth sport in Southern California and to promote the role of sport in society. Presently there are 42,000 PDF files represented by 220,000 printed pages. The

major files contain the complete backrun of the Olympic Review in English and French, the Official Reports, many academic sport sciences serials, sport monographs and a representative number of sport magazines. AAF conserves their digital assets on DVDs and also saves the website information 12 times per year.

Goals for the next few years include:

- Publishing research reports on aspects of youth sports
- Publishing a newsletter for coaches
- Organizing a yearly conference
- Increasing the size of the coaching education program
- Doubling the number of website visits by 2010

Copyright and intellectual property issues loom large for AAF now and in the future. The hunt for copyright holders is fraught with many problems as countless library/archival collection managers/librarians/archivists are aware.

AAF will also change their non-circulation policy in January 2007 and will circulate the books in the regular collection. Reference services will also now be limited to 20 minutes and thereafter a fee will be charged. For further information see the AAF website, <http://www.aafla.org/>.

The final session was conducted by Rand Jerris, from the USGA. Below is a summary of his speech on the resources of the United States Golf Association Museum and Archives.

United States Golf Association

One of the speakers at the recent ISHA/NASLIN conference was Rand Jerris, (PhD), Director of the Museum and Archives for the USGA. He presented an address on the history and development of the USGA Library and Archives. Presently located in Far Hills, NJ, the USGA was founded in 1894 with the Museum and Library becoming an entity in 1935. The following statistics indicate the depth and breadth of the collections held:

The Museum has 42,000 artifacts

The Library has

- 20,000 volumes
- 500 serial titles
- 600 scrapbooks (from the 1890s to 1930s mainly),
- 1200 rare books (18th & 19th century imprints with many early Scottish publications)

The Archives have

- Papers of Bob Jones, Walter Travis and Peter Dobereiner and others
- More than 10,000 course scorecards from many decades (are especially useful for golf course history)
- Sheet Music – over 200 golf songs and music
- Audio broadcast tapes of the US Open and other tournaments from the 1950s to date
- Photos - 50,000 black and white from the 19th century to 1970s
- More than half a million color slides from 1972 to 2001
- Digital photographs from 2002 to date

- USGA association archives 1894 to date (golf yearbooks, correspondence, minutes, etc)

The SEGL Electronic Golf Library was started in 2004 with more than 100 19th century golf books and periodical issues digitized. A re-launch of this digital collection will take place next year when some of the material is re-digitized by Annapolis Technologies to a higher standard. The user interface and search engine will also be upgraded, along with more security for the files.

The more than 100,000 current digital photographs are managed by a system known as MediaBank that was developed by the Wave Corporation (<http://www.wavecorp.com/>) located in Florida. This digital asset and content management company facilitates the USGA's efforts to license its images from the US Open and other USGA championships. Each photo has an abstract and key words so that account users can find the photo they need. This revenue stream is important for the USGA. In addition the IMG Company in London, that also markets the IOC video resources, is another marketing partner of the USGA.

Future collection building include discussions on the feasibility of creating a golf course architecture archives with resources from some of the leading golf course designers and also acquiring more personal papers of leading golf players, managers and coaches.

The valuable and extensive USGA artifact and research collection will soon be housed in a state-of-the-art new facility called the Arnold Palmer Center for Golf History. The ground - breaking ceremonies took place in November with estimated completion date of December 1, 2007 and the official opening the following spring in 2008.

Conference Conclusion

The field trips on Friday afternoon were to the Stax Museum of Soul Music. This small museum has delightful content with a superior layout, floor plan and displays.

New Hockey Museum Opened

On October 29, 2006, a new hockey museum was opened in Bowmanville, Ontario. Housed in the Richard Complex this museum has 1300 artifacts donated by Canadian broadcaster Brian McFarlane. The Prime Minister of Canada, Stephan Harper, attended the opening along with Mr. McFarlane, Red Kelly, Frank Mahovlich and other hockey greats.

The Billie Jean King International Women's Sports Center

Plans are progressing on the establishment of the Billie Jean King International Women's Sports Center that will be part of the National Sports Museum being constructed at 26 Broadway in New York City. The Women's Sports Foundation in East Meadow, NY has the opportunity to create a comprehensive women's sport museum exhibit that would provide a permanent home for the recognition of contributions made to women's sports by extraordinary sportswomen who deserve greater recognition by the public at large. This 3000 square foot exhibit space will provide a permanent home for the International Women's Sport Hall of Fame, interactive educational area for visitors to learn the history and achievements of individual women and girls in sports, explore the role of coach, team player and family in the development of the female athlete and offer an online resource center to describe the benefits of sport and physical activity.

The location of the National Sports Museum is in the tourist corridor between the Statue of Liberty and the World Trade Center Memorial. A funding drive has been started to find the \$6 million needed to develop the exhibit, educational programs and traveling exhibits for the WSF over the next 10 years.
